

Guinness World Records

- » Guinness World Records, known from its inception in 1955 until 1999 as The Guinness Book of Records and in previous United States editions as The Guinness Book of World Records, is a reference book published annually, listing world records both of human achievements and the extremes of the natural world.
- » Ultimately, the benefits of being a Guinness record holder is the self satisfaction that you set a goal for yourself that no one else on Earth ever achieved and succeeded.
- » As of the 2021 edition, it is now in its 66th year of publication, published in 100 countries and 23 languages, and maintains over 53,000 records. The international franchise has extended beyond print to include television series and museums.



Guinness World Records 2020

1. Guinness record name: World's largest onion

Who: Team of surma takeaway stevenage , oli khan

What: 175.48 KILOGRAM(S)

Where: United Kingdom

When: 04 February 2020



- » The giant onion bhaji that was cooked up in London on the 4th February 2020, weighed 175.48 kg (386 lb 13.8 oz)!The onion bhaji was made by Oli Khan and a team of 25 from the Surma Takeaway Stevenage in London at the London Muslim Centre in Whitechapel.
 - » The attempt took place before any social distancing measures were put in place in the UK. The team were ecstatic as Guinness World Records adjudicator Paulina Sapinska declared the record broken for the largest onion bhaji with a total diameter of 153 cm.

2. Guinness record name: Long mustache

Who: Ram Singh Chauhan

What: 4.29 Metre(S)

Where: Rajasthan, India

When: 2020



The longest moustache measures 4.29 m (14 ft) and belongs to Ram Singh Chauhan (India). It was measured on the set of the Italian TV show “Lo Show dei Record” in Rome, Italy.

3. Guinness record name: world’s largest 3D painting

Who: Sacha Jafri

What: 1595.76 Square Metre(S)

Where: United Arab Emirates (Dubai)

When: 29 September 2020



The largest art canvas is 1,595.76 m² (17,176 ft² 79 in²) and was achieved by Sacha Jafri (United Kingdom), in Dubai, UAE on 29 September 2020. Sacha Jafri created the largest art canvas, on which he created the Journey of Humanity. The project took place in Atlantis, Dubai and achieved a total size of 1,595.76 Square meters.

4. Guinness record name: longest legs in the world

Who: Maci Currin

What: 135.26 AND 134.3 Centimetre(S)

Where: United States (Cedar Park)

When: 21 February 2020



- » Maci Currin was certified by Guinness World Records as having the world's longest legs (female) and the longest legs of a teenager. The 17-year-old from Cedar Park, Texas, stands 6 feet, 10 inches tall. Her legs - both of which measure over 4 feet - make up 60% of her total height.
 - » According to Guinness World Records, Ms Currin's left leg measures 135.267 cm (53.255 in), while her right leg measures 134.3 cm (52.874 in).

5. Guinness record name: Most piercing on his face

Who: Rolf Buchholz

What: 4.29 Metre(S)

Where: Germany

When: 25 October 2020



- » A man from Germany has set a Guinness World Record for the most number of body modifications. Rolf Buchholz has more than 516 body modifications, and he says he is not yet done altering his body, reports news website UPI.
 - » According to Guinness World Records, Rolf works in information technology for a telecoms company in Germany. It was only at the age of 40 that he started on the journey of body modifications by getting his first ever tattoo and piercing. In the more than 20 years since, he has been rendered almost unrecognisable with several piercings along his lips, eyebrows, nose and even two small horns on his forehead.

6. Guinness record name: longest nail

What: 576.4 cm (18 ft 10.9 in)

Where: USA

When: 07 February 2020



- » Famously known as the woman with the world's longest fingernails, Guinness World Records title holder Ayanna Williams (USA) has officially parted with her grand manicure after cutting her nails this past weekend.
 - » Dr. Allison Readinger of Trinity Vista Dermatology in Forth Worth, Texas (USA), used an electric rotary tool to cut the record holder's lengthy nails after measuring them a final time.

7. Guinness record name: Kurt Cobain's guitar sold for a record-breaking \$6 million.

Who: Jeremy Lanig

What: Guitar sold for \$6 million this year

Where: Los Angeles

When: 05-Aug-2020



- » Kurt Cobain's guitar from Nirvana's iconic MTV Unplugged performance sold at auction Saturday for a record \$6 million. The previous record was \$3.95 million for a Black Stratocaster owned by Pink Floyd's David Gilmour.
- » Pre-auction bids on the 1959 Martin D-18E, purchased by the Nirvana singer at Los Angeles' Voltage Guitars and modified for the left-handed Cobain, reached \$1 million even bidding officially opened. The guitar received seven bids total, including the winning bid of \$6,010,00, the Julien's Auctions website stated.
